Some people argue that the best way to improve road safety is to increase the legal driving age. To what extent do you agree or disagree with this statement?

Different people have different thoughts on the idea of raising the legal driving age to make the roads safer. Safety on the roads must come first, but raising the age to drive alone is not the only solution that needs to be thought through carefully.

One reason to raise the age of legalisation for driving is the thought that younger drivers, who often don't have much experience, may be more dangerous on the roads. Supporters say that delaying the issue of driving licences gives people more time to grow up and learn more about responsibility, which could lead to safer driving habits.

However, there is a counterargument that questions the idea that age is the only factor that determines how well someone can drive. As you get older, some drivers may develop dangerous habits, while some younger drivers act responsibly. Increasing the legal driving age might not take into account how mature, responsible, and ready to drive each person is. A better way to do things would be to teach all drivers, no matter what age, safe driving habits through thorough driver education programmes.

It is also important to think about how this might affect people's ability to go to school and find work. If the legal driving age is pushed back, it might be harder for young people to get to school and jobs in places with limited public transport. This could hurt their general development.

In conclusion, road safety is very important, but the idea to raise the legal driving age needs to be looked at carefully. Instead of using age alone as a criterion, it would be better to have complete driver education programmes that deal with the real reasons why people get into car accidents. Finding a balance between promoting road safety and thinking about how it will affect people is important for putting in place measures that make driving safer and more responsible overall.
